

HYS Purpose

- Identify and monitor factors that affect the health of youth in Washington
- Similar youth surveys have been conducted across the state since 1988
- Survey results can indicate changes in health behaviors over time and schools can use the results to identify important areas of need



HYS 2021

- First primarily-electronic HYS
- Over 208,000 students
- All 39 Counties
- 215 school districts
- 877 schools
 - ▶ 8 not associated with a school district
 - > 3 Charter schools
 - > 1 Tribal school
 - > The School for the Blind
 - > 3 Private Schools





HYS 2021

"The COVID-19 pandemic led to massive changes in the lives of Washington youth. Increases and decreases in HYS 2021 data may be more a reflection of the pandemic and its affect on our lives than a change that would have happened if the pandemic had not occurred. This means that **trend data from before the pandemic and during/after the pandemic should be interpreted with tremendous caution**."

HYS Participation

- Any Washington public school with students in grades 6, 8, 10, or 12.
 - Small school districts (<150 students in grades 6, 8, 10, 12) can survey additional grades 7, 9, and 11
 - ► Tribal schools
 - Online/virtual schools
 - Private schools can participate on request
 - No detention facilities



Why should my school participate?

- Important information for schools
 - Learn the prevalence of health-related behaviors among students
 - Understand the school climate
 - Contribute to the School Improvement Planning process
 - Help inform other needs assessments
 - Help justify new school programs, projects or staffing
 - Assist with evaluating or improving existing school programs or projects
 - Provide information for writing grant applications
- Comparisons to state results and past results
- Free!
- Useful data to partners who share the goal of healthy youth!



Student Protections

- HYS is anonymous and voluntary
- HYS is reviewed by the Washington State Institutional Review Board (WSIRB)
- This includes, but isn't limited to approval of:
 - Methods
 - Materials
 - Parent and student notification processes
 - Survey questions
 - Data and results sharing requirements





How are the results used? DOH







How are the results used? OSPI

- Data from the survey can help raise awareness of youth thoughts, feelings and behaviors and provide insight on current health trends and concerns
- Results can help schools make evidence-based decisions that lead not only to positive academic outcomes but also provides information that allows schools to identify conditions that impact student learning and the overall school climate
- Data can also be used by schools and communities to apply for grants, and inform programming and planning
 - LifeSkills Grant: teach youth how to cope with and manage stress and anxiety, build positive relationship and communication skills, and develop refusal skills to prevent and reduce substance use and abuse



How are the results used? HCA

- Prioritizing funding for areas with highest need
- Evaluating outcomes over time
- Substance Use Disorder Prevention and Mental Health Promotion Interagency State Strategic Plan
- Community-Based Organization (CBO) grants for substance use disorder prevention and mental health promotion/suicide prevention
- Community Prevention and Wellness Initiative (CPWI) in nearly 100 communities
- Leveraging additional funding and resources

Exemptions and Optional Questions

Exemption for sexual behavior and/or sexual violence questions for 8th grade and older.

This year, questions about sexual behavior and sexual violence are included in the main body of the survey for 8th graders and older. These are not part of a removable section as they have been in previous years. For schools with concerns about asking these questions in the main body of the survey, there is an exemption process for 2023.

Optional new 6th grade gender question.

Every year on the HYS, students are asked the question: What sex were you assigned at birth?

Female, Male. This year, schools can decide to also ask 6th graders (and 7th graders in small school districts) about gender. The new question is:

What is your gender?

Boy

Girl

Something else fits better.


Schools can add the new gender question to the elementary survey by opting in on the registration form.

The U.S. Department of Education emphasizes the importance of collecting high quality data on both sex and gender. Gender diverse youth are at increased risk of adverse experiences. Collecting both sex and gender on student surveys allows communities to better understand and meet the needs of all youth.




